



HIDDEN WATERWAYS

An on-going project to creatively interpret people's memories, stories and community history of the Shrewsbury Canal. Focusing on community engagement to increase investment and positive attitudes towards the canal's restoration. Have a look on our website at all the creative activities this project has already produced! Funded by the National Lottery Heritage Fund and Shropshire Council, in partnership with ArtShack, Virtual Shropshire, Shrewsbury and Newport Canals Trust, Friends of the Flaxmill Maltings, Shropshire Archives & Shrewsbury Library.

LAC BAND BUILD

The Hive continues its relationship with Shropshire Virtual School as we see the return of the LAC Summer Band Build, it is nearly 2 years since care experienced young people in Shropshire were able to come together with our professional musicians to craft some original pieces and belt out some covers. The performance on day 4 will be one to savour.

MYCOLLEGE

Short courses designed to support young people to develop self-belief, life skills, raise their future aspirations whilst being mentored. Participants will explore creative media such as Art Club, Stop!motion animation, manga comics, poetry, creative writing and voice over workshops. Includes a Summer Band Build in August at The Hive. Open to 16 – 35 years who are not in Education, Employment or Training living in Shropshire, Telford & Wrekin. Access by referral only. Funded by The National Lottery Community Fund Reaching Communities.



HOPE HOUSE HOSPICE

The Hive has been commissioned by Hope House Hospice in Oswestry and Ty Gobaiith to run a short series of creative online Summer workshops for siblings of oncology patients. These include story-telling, hip hop poetry and found sound music making. Our professional artists will deliver a total of 12 one hour sessions on Zoom in August.



MYC MUSIC

Weekly 2-hour song-writing and music-making workshops at The Hive. Designed to encourage friendships, collaborative working and build confidence. Open to 16 – 35 years at risk of loneliness and isolation living in Shropshire, Telford & Wrekin. Access by referral only. Funded by The National Lottery Community Fund Reaching Communities.



PARACHUTES

These interactive creative sessions for parents, carers and children under 5 years take place twice a month (currently on Zoom) and include craft activities, storytelling and messy play. Designed for families living in Harlescott, Shrewsbury to build relationships and develop children's creativity, sensory and essential social skills. Funded by BBC Children in Need Small Grants and delivered in partnership with Elim Riversway Church.



REACH OUT TO MUSIC

Weekly music workshops help young people learn about creating music, increase their sense of self-belief and build a growing engagement with their community. Designed for 10 – 17 year olds who are not in Education, Employment or Training and taking place at The Grange, Harlescott. This project is funded by Youth Music Fund A via Shrewsbury Town Council.



YOUNG PROGRAMMERS

Aiming to engage young people in professional elements of concert promotion, with a focus on developing skills and experience in high-quality artistic programming, sound engineering, marketing and promotion for small-to-medium sized venues. This project is open to young people living in Shropshire, Telford & Wrekin aged 14 – 25 years who are interested in forging careers in this industry. Funded by Arts Council England: Supporting Grassroots Live Music.
